Common leak locations include dripping faucets, toilet flappers and showerheads. To see if you have leaks, check your water meter before and after a 2-hour window while all your water is shut off. If the meter does not read the same, chances are you have a leak.

## Be Mindful of the Water You Use

Truth is, unless we're in a drought many of us don't really think about our water use. The good news is that it's easy to save a lot of water with just a little effort. Here are a few ideas:

- Don't pre-wash dishes in the sink if you have a dishwasher.
- While running water is heating up, collect it to water plants.

- Teach your children to turn off faucets completely.

# Water Lawns and Plants Efficiently
