AI OUTPUTS MAY NOT BE ACCURATE



FALSE OUTPUTS MAY BE CAUSED BY:

- INACCURATE OR DATED TRAINING CONTENT
- TRAINING METHODS OR DATA INTRODUCING BIAS
- UNCLEAR USER PROMPTS

OVER 100 YEARS OF CASE LAW HAS REQUIRED **HUMAN AUTHORSHIP** FOR COPYRIGHT PROTECTION.

DON'T USE AI TO CREATE CONTENT YOU WANT TO PROTECT.

ADOPT BEST PRACTICES FOR USE OF THIRD-PARTY WORKS: GET PERMISSION IN WRITING & SAVE IT.

DESCRIBE HOW AI MAY BE USED IN VENDOR CONTRACTS.

PROTECT PERSONAL AND CONFIDENTIAL DATA

CYBERSECURITY AND AI



USER PROMPTS BECOME TRAINING MATERIAL FOR THE AI TOOL.

USER PROMPTS INCLUDING CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION COULD BE USED TO TRAIN THE AI TOOL, AND THE AI TOOL COULD ULTIMATELY GENERATE CONTENT THAT DISCLOSES THE CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.

AI TOOLS ARE SUBJECT TO CYBERSECURITY VULNERABILITIES JUST LIKE ANY OTHER WEBSITE OR APP.

BEST PRACTICES TO MITIGATE DATA PRIVACY AND CYBERSECURITY RISKS

DO NOT INPUT PERSONAL & CONFIDENTIAL DATA INTO AI TOOLS.

2

COMPLY WITH DATA PRIVACY LAWS.

3

REVIEW AI PRIVACY POLICIES & OPT OUT OF TRAINING DATA, IF POSSIBLE.

4

ADDRESS USE OF AI IN VENDOR CONTRACTS VIA CONFIDENTIALITY CLAUSES.
