Land Use and Development

As the economy rebounds and real estate development increases, local jurisdictions will refocus on land use controls. Many localities may need to rewrite their zoning ordinances or update their comprehensive plans. Market studies are showing that walkable communities yield higher property values. You can help shape growth patterns in your community to be more responsive to market needs, such as density, multifamily development, and mixed-use and walkable communities.

Growth through Enhanced Transportation

Effective transportation facilities are vital for economic growth and real estate value. Shorter commutes and more walkable neighborhoods matter to a growing number of people and properties with nearby access to public transportation are worth more than those without access to transit. Transit Oriented Development (TOD) helps stabilize neighborhoods through affordable housing initiatives and new business development. You can be an advocate for improved transportation facilities and TOD in your community.







Downtown Revitalization & Placemaking

Placemaking helps to revitalize neighborhoods by transforming underutilized or vacant public spaces into vibrant community spaces. Small-scale improvements to a public space in a town or neighborhood can often bring big benefits and more improvements. Main Street and Build a Better Block approaches find uses for vacant properties and can turn a downtown around. You can help return vacant commercial properties to productive use and revitalize your community or downtown.
